II. Minutes – No minutes

III. Office Updates - Corrine Duncan

- Today, Canvass Day, we certify the primary election.
- A handout was distributed to the board with a breakdown of the budget as requested by Braine at a previous meeting.
- After today's meeting we will finalize voter history so voters can check their voting history online.
- Handed out a physical copy of the abstract to all entities including the State Board.
- On the 21st we will send out the certificate of nominations.
- The state canvass will be on the 26th.
- Next meeting will be on April 9th.
- A deadline is coming up for election protests on Tuesday the 19th, but we don't have any. For the general election if we have some, the last time to request a protest is 5pm. the Monday after the election.

IV. Finalize Early Voting Plan for the 2nd Primary (G.S. § 163-277.6) - Neggy Fox

- Neggy presented slides showing the voter turnout of two previous 2nd. primaries. In 2020 for a Republican primary there were 1,424 voters, 66 of which voted between the hours of 5-6pm. One site was open from 8-6pm at the warehouse. In 2016 the 2nd primary for both parties was held at 59 Woodfin for ten days 10-6pm. There were 1,715 voters, of which 99 voted between 5-6 pm.
- Neggy emphasized that to open the primary site past normal business hours would trigger the mandated uniform hours of 8-7:30pm Monday through Friday.
- Neggy recommended opening from 8-5 Monday through Friday and 8-3 the last Saturday at 59 Woodfin.
- The Republican chair has sent an email to Election Services requesting no Early Voting for the 2nd Primary, but it is mandated.
- Mr. Aceto made a motion to approve staff recommendation. Passed 5-0

V. Verification of Addresses (SDR returned undeliverable) (G.S. § 163-82.7(c)) – Devin Whitney

- Devin noted that SBOE numbered memo 2023-05 gives guidance on dealing with this issue.
- Four same day registrants did not respond to correspondence.
- Staff recommends removal of those four ballots from vote totals.
- Jake made a motion to remove from primary totals. Passed 5-0

VI. Administrative Challenges (G.S. § 163-89) – Devin Whitney

- There were two challenges due to voters passing away before Election Day.
- Jake made a motion to remove deceased voters' ballots from the primary totals. The motion passed 5-0
- There was a voter from Black Mountain precinct 28.1, who requested one style ballot then changed his mind. He was given a provisional ballot and did not select any races. The blank ballot was spoiled. The blank ballot had to be duplicated and voted on. Jake made a motion to duplicate. Passed 5-0
- The duplication team assembled and processed the ballots.
- Devin stated there would be no change in vote totals.

VII. Presentation of Audit (G.S. § 163-182.5) - Corinne Duncan

• Corrine presented the sample audit to the Board. The State selected one Early Voting location and one Election Day precinct.

• There were no differences between the hand counts and the machine counts.

VIII. Presentation of Reports & Certification of Election (G.S. § 163-182, G.S. § 163-182.5) – Corinne Duncan

- Corrine handed out last night's provisional summary totaling 130 approved ballots out of 314 reviewed.
- That made 0.22% of the 59,648 ballots cast in the primary.
- Justin presented the Absentee summary. There were 2,833 absentee requests. 1589 were received. 323 had ID affidavits. Numbers matched.
- Devin presented the Early Voting summary. The total was 26,145 and the numbers matched.
- Bria presented the Election Day summary and the audit summary. Pct. 1.1 had
 one voting discrepancy causing the numbers to be one off. Of 59,648 votes
 there was one error.
- Bria printed out the final numbers of the primary, in triplicate, for the State Board, the Clerk's office, and one copy for our BOE. All Board members signed the three reports.
- Jake then made a motion to certify the primary. The motion passed 5-0 and the election was certified.
- The reports will be notarized.
